I recently spent an engaging hour with the students of Freman College. As an apologist (some would say apology) for the Christian faith, I was subjected to an hour's grilling by the incisive but courteous youth of today.

As I sat helpless (or hapless), my interrogators lobbed down such hand grenades as 'Who made God?', 'Do we have the right to take someone's life?' and even 'Do we still need marriage?' At the point at which I was reduced to asking for an easy one on sport, I realised I was unlikely to be asked back any time soon.

And yet I wasn't asked the one I dreaded, which was the big one on suffering. It was topical at the time, coming between the shocking events in New Zealand and Japan, and amidst the upheaval in North Africa, which shows no abating even as I write.

It isn't that the Christian faith has nothing to say on the causes of suffering, because it does. But what it has to say starts from a point of weakness, with a God who limits his ability to act, to the point where he will effectively allow those that he loves to reject and crucify his only Son Jesus Christ.

Our understanding of suffering therefore begins with the unsatisfactory realisation that God does not always remove, prevent or explain what confronts us. But it goes on to acknowledge that he enters and shares that suffering – in short, he is in it with us.

If the message of Easter is about anything, it is about God's desire to be in it with us, to experience, share, and ultimately transform the pain and limitation of what our lives have become into the hope of something more just, meaningful and glorious, whether now or in times to come.

Believe me, I have plenty more questions of my own to which I'm seeking answers, and I long for the day when all is made clear, and explanation is added to consolation. But I do have an abiding trust in the power of the cross and the promise of resurrection that offers strength for the present and hope for the future.

Win Barnes

With Win's death on 16th February, the village and its surrounding community has lost one of its most loved and memorable residents. She was appointed organist at All Saints Church on 19th September 1943 at the age of 19, and on 21st July 1954 she became organist of St Catherine's, Sacombe, as well. By this time she had two daughters under the age of four, but she managed to play three services each Sunday while her husband Edwin ("also known as "Win") looked after the Sunday lunch.

Declining health in the last few years meant that her presence on the organ bench had to become less regular, but she served the church at Little Munden for at least 66 years, and at Sacombe for 55. This achievement was marked in 2007 when she received an award from the High Sheriff of Hertfordshire for her service to the community. To quote the citation for this award:

"It was not only at the organ bench that Win served God's Kingdom; from her home in the centre of the village of Dane End she gave witness to the whole community, through the strong, patient and unshakeable faith in a loving God which she lived out every day."

We will remember her with an affectionate smile.

CENSUS – HOW THINGS HAVE CHANGED

Censuses have been conducted in Britain every ten years since 1801. The only exception was in 1941, during the Second World War. The Government did, however, have a fairly accurate measure of the population from the National Registration of 1939, carried out to issue identity cards. All the early census returns, prior to 1841, have been destroyed, but summaries do exist and give us a view into life on our parishes in those days.

On 27th May 1811 Great Munden had a population of 457, Little Munden 430 and Sacombe 308. The census asked how many families were working, "chiefly in agriculture", "chiefly in trade, manufacturing or handicrafts" or "some other not covered by those two classes". Of the 92 families in Great Munden, 80 worked on the land, 11 in the trade class and one "other", probably the family of the rector, William Fonnereau. The three parishes all had separate rectors at this time who were, incidentally, responsible for collecting the census information and providing the return.

Little Munden had 85 of its 96 families in agriculture, 7 in trade and 4 otherwise occupied families. By contrast, in Sacombe 61 of the 63 families were occupied in agriculture with only one in trade and one other, again probably the rector, Thomas Lloyd's family.

Between 1821 and 1961, Great Munden's population had shrunk from 515 to 403, and Sacombe's from 341 to 198, while Little Munden's had grown from 464 to 515. Since then, boundaries have been re-drawn, so comparisons get more difficult, but clearly Little Munden has continued to grow.

The committee has been very busy researching into the design, manufacture, availability and cost of the different types of skate boarding ramps available. Also considerable research effort has been put into the availability of grants & funds to pay for the costs of purchase and installation.

Much thought must also be given as to the best location for the equipment (should we be able to afford the costs involved) With the existing evening problems on Horses Meadow (as highlighted in previous newsletters) will this be the best location for a ramp? Would it not perhaps go behind the Memorial Hall, or on the small green behind the houses between Gladstone Rd & Founcely Avenue, perhaps on one of the existing pieces of common land in the Parish, even on the large area of common land hopefully to be bought back into the control of the Parish? It must all be discussed in depth with all interested parties.

**LITTLE MUNDEN PARISH COUNCIL
Précis of Minutes of Parish Council Meeting
Held on 17th March**

The meeting was attended by the Chairman David Metcalf and Councillors, Jonathan Pool, Brian Long, Jenny McIntosh and Lizzie Bacon.

There had been no formal Parish Council Meeting in February due to sickness and holidays so matters arising from the January minutes were discussed. These included matters such as reclamation of Common Lane, the Parish Charity Commission and Parish Maintenance.

Planning Applications were then discussed, a full list of these which include new applications, decisions and appeals are available to view on www.mundens.net, March minutes of the Parish Council.

The monthly Finance report was also discussed which again is available to view on the Website.

The Council then went through correspondence received and sent, discussing anything of relevance and any resulting actions. A letter had been received from Hertfordshire Highways requesting that Ian Bishop, from the Department do a walk round in April, with representatives from the Parish Council to discuss highway matters. It was felt that this would be an excellent opportunity to discuss the state of the roads, in particular potholes and also to discuss traffic calming measures throughout the Parish.

The Little Munden Parish Action Plan was then discussed. Each Action Point generated from the Village Appraisal Questionnaire was discussed and progress reported. Most significantly two meetings had been held to discuss Youth matters in February and March and progress had been made into the acquisition of a Skateboard ramp. However it was felt that further consideration must be given to Parishioners who might have concerns over this. Volunteers had come forward to determine whether planning permission was required for the equipment. It was felt that Horses' Meadow was the most suitable location but further consideration would be given for alternative sites.

The forthcoming Election on 5th May was also discussed. Anthony Brown has resigned from the Council and Brian Long will not be standing again. The Council would welcome interest from anyone who would like to join the Parish Council. Nomination papers are available from the Parish Clerk.
