Dad obviously swallowed the line about it not making much difference because he never complained, and we carried on believing that our own shoes weren't really making much of a difference since the task was already enormous.*

*The smarter one amongst you will realise that beneath this whimsical reminiscence is something important about personal identity and responsibility (no, really there is). And I think it's this: I frequently tell people how much God loves them and that Jesus died for them to make good our friendship with God, but I now realise that I find it all too easy to take the view that if Jesus was doing that for millions of others, then counting me in was no big deal – after all, what difference does one more make?*

*The penny dropped for me one afternoon in a busy shopping centre, where I paused to hold open a door for some fellow shoppers. Rather than the one person I intended, a veritable multitude poured through the door, delaying my own progress for at least half an hour. The final woman to pass through (not the drop-dead gorgeous, leggy one I'd originally held the door for) asked me if I would have done all that just for her. I smiled, lied, and said that of course I would.*

*Now possibly I'm the only Vicar who sees the light through footwear, shopping centres or his own untruths, but I was moved to ask God if he would really have let Jesus die if it was only me, and I hadn't been able to sneak in with all the others. I think you can guess the answer. I'm going to be in church on Easter Day to thank him. How about you?*

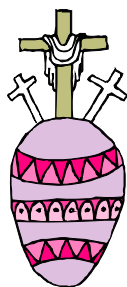

### **Looking Forward to Lindsey**

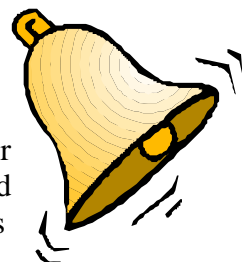

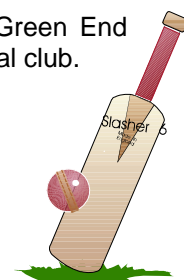

These titles, only available on subscription are offered free to library members. Just follow the instructions on the screen.
