Nettles may be cut immediately.

Where the grass is long it should be raked off in order to prevent an increase in soil fertility which is detrimental to wild flowers. Please add cut grass to the compost heap in the NW corner of the churchyard.

Please do not mow areas containing wild flowers to 'bowling-green length' as this would eventually result in the plants being destroyed.

**The real Green Deal... please stand up**

Is grant support for home insulation soon to be replaced by loans? The government's latest proposals certainly imply this.

The Green Deal proposes to spread the cost of new home insulation across future energy bills associated with a property. It is hoped that this will remove any obvious barrier to getting the work done. A guiding principle is that insulation installed must save the householder more money than the extra charge on their bills.

However, we don't yet know how much loan interest repayments will add to the cost. Currently cavity wall and loft insulation cost under £100 each in some areas thanks to Council grants. The Energy Saving Trust estimates households can save £115 each year with cavity wall insulation. This is a remarkable return on investment.

Get insulation installed in 2011 and you'll benefit from a grant. Beyond March 2012, when energy supplier grants are up for review, this is much less certain. So, for householders with savings, no intention of moving home and no desire to pay interest on a loan, today's best offers arguably represent the *real* green deal.

## LITTLE MUNDEN SCHOOL

Here we are, in the final term of the academic year, and preparations for the end of term are already being put in to place! Pupils in Classes 3 and 4 have been auditioning for parts for our annual musical performance- this year, 'Cinderella Rockerfella', and costumes, props and scenery are being gathered and assembled.

As I write this we are in the middle of D.T. week. The mouth-watering smells of carrot fudge and mock apricot tarts being made by Class 4 are wafting through my office door. They have also constructed model Andersen shelters, junk clothing and hydraulic puppets. Robots with flashing eyes and pasta jewellery are being constructed in Class 3. Class 2 have been making jewellery, birdfeeders, smoothies and puppets as well as designing costumes and in Class 1 the children have made photo-frames, purses, instruments, flip-flops and models. Friday will be a day of kite making and flying across the school - what fun! All the activities have been linked in to the

topic based curriculum we have been developing over the past year and the children are really seeing how learning is linked across all subjects.



One of the big topics this year has been World War 2 and life in the 1940s. Most of the children from years 3 to 6 spent 3 days at Lincolnsfield in Bushey, living as evacuees. They had rationed food, experienced an air-raid, took part in 1940s lessons and rode on an American jeep. I think the highlight of their stay though, was having an entire indoor soft-play space to themselves - nothing to do with the 1940s! We are now planning our next residential to Kingswood in Norfolk for next February where the focus is on ICT and outdoor activities.

Much of the learning the children have done in Classes 3 and 4 has been focussed on the war and we have been lucky to have visits from some people who remember life at that time and have told the children about their experiences. A big thank you to Mr Casbard, whose grandchildren are at our school and to Mr Hicks, for coming in to share their experiences.

Class 2 have been learning about food and people from history and have been ably supported by our two student teachers Miss Cawsey and Miss Clarke. They have been cooking and model making and produced a fabulous assembly for parents and friends.

Class 1 have had their annual visit to Mr Williams' farm to see the lambs being born and we had a batch of chicks hatched in the classroom, thanks to Mrs Howard. The living and growing topic has produced some fantastic work, which the parents enjoyed seeing during the class assembly.

Again we have supported a number of charities over the last few months including Red Nose Day when we all wore red and raised £157, Children in Need, for who we raised £134 We have also raised £374 for Keech Hospice Care and we are supporting Mrs Chapman and Mrs Wood who will be climbing Mount Kilimanjaro next January to raise money for a range of charities.

We started this ½ term with a focus on the Royal Wedding and learning about the Royal Family. Each class celebrated in their own style and Mrs Parfitt cooked us a wonderful Royal Wedding lunch. The younger children came dressed as princes and princesses and the older children came dressed to go to a wedding! It really has been a ½ term of fun and celebration and we are ending this ½ term with a D.T. exhibition for the parents and a chance for them to come and see what has been happening in the classrooms during D.T. week.

We are coming back to school on Monday 6<sup>th</sup> June and on Friday 10<sup>th</sup> we will be having an eco day. We will be collecting electrical goods (anything with a plug or battery) for recycling. If you have anything that you would like to get rid of and you think would qualify for recycling, then please email the school office with details by Monday 6<sup>th</sup> June as we will only be able to take goods that have been logged with us. Items will need to be delivered to school on Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> 3.30pm-5pm or Friday 10<sup>th</sup> 8.30am-10am.

So we approach June and July with the usual trepidation - will we have everything ready for the end of year services and performances? Have we prepared everything for sports day? Are the leavers' gifts and photos sorted? Are the reports ready? Are we ready to watch as Year 6 move on to secondary school? This is my favourite term of the year - it is busy and fun and the weather is usually glorious (even though it has been raining this afternoon for the first time in weeks!) but it is always tinged with a little sadness as we know we will be losing part of our school family at the end.

This was the first meeting of the newly returned Parish Council, therefore the chair was initially taken by our Parish clerk Geraldine Ward who called upon the four returned councillors (Jenny McIntosh, Keith Williams, Lizzie Bacon & David Metcalf) to elect a chairman, David Metcalf (myself) was duly elected and took the chair for the meeting.

As the council is for 7 seats and only four had been returned "un-opposed" to obviate problems of the council not being quorum at future meetings ( four being a quorum ) it was decided to co-opt three parishioners (all who had expressed a serious interest or made miss-calculations on "returning-form" dates) onto the council, these being: Jonathan Pool, Darren Jones and Tony Bartells.

As it was the first meeting of the new council the meeting was fairly long for us as there was quite a lot of business to be discussed. Also here should be a précis of the meetings minutes from our clerk.

Amongst the items we discussed was a letter of thanks be sent to retiring Cllr. Brian Long thanking him for many years of diligent and caring service to the Parish. Brian will be missed. He has agreed to keep on his association with the "Combined charities" along with Tony Brown.

**Dog Fouling.** This problem keeps consistently raising its head, please clear up after your dog, whether it is on the fields or footpaths. There are dog dirt & ordinary bins provided. If you see anyone not bothering don't hesitate to reported them to *East Herts Environmental Service Team @ 01279 655361 ( 'e-mail' operations.admin@eastherts.gov.uk)* This is in particular a problem on the path leading up to the school from the village, small children tread in the dog

dirt and walk it all over the school. This causes considerable distress to the child, it also has to be cleared up by the school caretaker Martin, who I am reliably informed does not exactly relish the task. Also please do not allow your dog to run too loose, some people are scared of dogs and your happy and boisterous pet can cause them distress and anxiety, please control your pet.

#### **LITTLE MUNDEN PARISH COUNCIL PRECIS OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 19<sup>TH</sup> MAY AT LITTLE MUNDEN SCHOOL**

As this was the first meeting of the new council, the Clerk opened the meeting and asked for nominations for a Chairman. David Metcalf was returned as Chairman and the meeting commenced.

Three Councillors were then co-opted on to the Council: Jonathan Pool, Darren Jones and Tony Bartells.

Matters were discussed from the last meeting such as Common Land. Here significant progress has been made and a representative from HCC would be holding a site meeting on 26<sup>th</sup> May to identify the areas of Common Land which the Council are seeking to reclaim. It was hoped that when these are reclaimed they can be used for the good of the Community. Suggestions for their use include allotments, community orchards, a wildlife trail or recreational facilities for the youth of the Parish.

New planning applications and decisions were then discussed followed by the Parish Council's finances. The Councillors then discussed various items of correspondence and noted that a letter had been received from Tony Brown thanking the Council for his retirement gift which had been presented at the Annual Parish Meeting.

The Little Munden Parish Action Plan was then discussed and of significance was a report from David Metcalf on the Youth Meeting which had taken place on the previous Tuesday. Unfortunately there had been a poor turnout and due to a number of reasons the Committee had dwindled and no youth council had yet been formed despite recommendations that this would be a suitable way forward. The suggestion was made however, that the village hall could play a more significant role in youth activities and it was felt that it would be beneficial if a small youth group could be run from the back room, meeting once or twice a month. This would then form a suitable base from where they could discuss further facilities they may wish to develop.

Other items discussed regarding the Parish Plan included the mobile phone reception in the area and Keith Williams reported that Orange were dismantling the mast and had already taken away the electrical supply. He also confirmed that T Mobile had no plans to offer a mobile service in the future.

Any other business was then discussed and Jenny McIntosh reported that the Church Yard had been accredited by the Hertfordshire Wildlife Trust for the substantial variety of wild flowers that were growing there.

**Youth Projects Meeting 17<sup>th</sup> May**

Disappointingly, this meeting was not well attended, only 7 adults (including the committee) and 2 youngsters being present. Many ideas were discussed in depth, the input from the 2 youngsters present being most welcome, especially the views of the young lady present.

The committee members have still been busy researching into the design, manufacture, availability and cost of the different types of skate boarding ramps available. Much effort has been put into the availability of grants and funds to cover costs. East Herts Planning authority have been contacted re: positioning of ramp on Horses Meadow and this will not be a problem. We are very grateful to Gary Strevens for his professional help on this matter.

It was discussed by those present that it is seriously felt that we cannot really progress much further with this project until we get a lot more support from the whole community. We have, therefore, asked the youngsters to set up a youth council and then come to the committee with definite ideas of what they really want, also some ideas of how they can help raise funds to kick start their projects.

The committee itself must consist of parishioners. This committee will then present its plans to the Parish Council for approval and financial help. It is a conflict of interests for me to be chairman of both the committee and the PC.

Cllr. Liz Bacon. Cllr Tony Bartel and I will still attend meetings but not as officers.

I will chair the next meeting only. But it must be said that if more active support is not forthcoming from the community as a whole, we will have to call an end to this part of the parish plan project.

Right from the start two of our keenest volunteers have been Sandy & Kevin Davies, unfortunately Kevin has been struck down by a sudden and serious illness. I would like to pass on to Kevin our sincerest thanks for all the hard work he has put into this project; we wish him a complete and speedy recovery.
