### **Do you remember.....?**

*How good is your memory? Do you remember what you did yesterday, last week or even last month? How about five years ago? Bet that got you thinking!*

*If you are anything like me, then you'd probably struggle to remember what you did yesterday, let alone five or more years ago, unless of course it was something that was life changing, like having a child, getting married etc. This month we are all invited to be involved in something that began a very long time ago and involves remembering! Any ideas?*

*It's Remembrance Day, the day when we remember the men and women who have died or been injured whilst serving in the armed forces since World War I.*

*These people gave their lives so that we may live in freedom, and even today there are still people giving their lives in service so that you and I can live in freedom.*

*History tells us that at 11am on 11th of the 11th (November) 1918 the Armistice was signed, bringing the war (World War I) to an end; and every year at 11am on 11th November we have a time of silence in order to continue to remember those who have died in war since World War I. Some people may call this day 'Poppy Day' because of the red 'Remembrance' Poppy that has become a familiar symbol of Remembrance Day. Nationally, churches will hold a Remembrance service where we are all invited to come together and remember those who paid the price so that we can live in freedom. But, as we see, freedom is not free; it is thanks to the men and women of the armed services, who are willing to die for us, that we have this freedom; and this is a big cost to pay for our freedom. Christians can relate to this through our understanding of the death of Jesus, who we believe also died for us, for you and for me, not just for Christians. We believe that Jesus died to free everyone in the world from sin, and all we need to do is to choose to follow his path of freedom. Do you want to find out more about what this path involves, what it looks like? Then come along to our Remembrance service on Sunday 13th November at 10.30am, either at Standon or Little Munden Church, or to any of our services. In the meantime, let us remember to thank God for those who have paid the price for our freedom. Amen .*

### **Re: Little Munden Consolidated Charities.**

It will come as no surprise to many of you that our parish is rather old, the church alone having been the centre of our community for the best part of a millennium. History walks with us. We all know that we are living through increasingly hard times, but this is not new, People were aware of the struggle other parishioners have been having in the past, and they tried to help, actually they still are helping. There is set up for the "parishioners of Little Munden" a very small charitable fund, colloquially referred to as the "Consolidated Charities"

The original bequest dates back to the Ralph Fordham Will dated the 17<sup>th</sup>. August 1591. Then various other bequests dating from 1666 to 1886. (One charity being a "penny" bread fund, another a "apprentices" tools/clothes/trunk fund) These were 'consolidated' by the Charity Commission on the 3<sup>rd</sup>. December 1912.

In consolidation the Charity Commission stated that one trustee must be the local vicar. The other two trustee to be appointed (every four years) by the Parish

Council, these trustees being (at present) Tony Brown and Brian Long. The trustees normally met briefly every 6 months and distributed any interest accrued (very small amounts) to beneficiaries/good causes/apprentices as strictly set out in the 1912 papers.

This duty is in fact still carried out as and when required. The Parish council is very keen that these small charitable financial distributions are kept up. Especially as we have to report to the Charity Commissioners and Local Government regulators that they are!

Winter approaches, cold weather and long dark cold nights will be here soon. As Parish Council chairman, I would like to ask that if any parishioner knows of any other parishioner, perhaps elderly, perhaps alone, who is just struggling to make ends meet, who would benefit from a small, completely discreet, but possibly vital financial aid.

If you think you see a deserving recipient please ring Tony Brown (01920 438484) as soon as you possibly can, the greatest discretion is used, even I as PC chairman have no knowledge of such confidential transactions.

### **LITTLE MUNDEN MEMORIAL HALL** **1914 – 1918.**

The Memorial Hall is a registered charity (No. 302426) The Hall was built to act as a memorial to the fallen of WW1. Part of its ethos is (and I quote from the Charity Commissioners site):

“TO PROVIDE AS MUCH HELP WITH DISCOUNT LETTINGS TO ALL VILLAGE ORGANISATIONS AND CHILDREN'S PARTIES ON APPLICATION, WHICH ENABLES THEM TO PROVIDE A SERVICE AT REASONABLE CHARGES, SO TO ENABLE PEOPLE WITH LOW INCOME CAN JOIN”

The Memorial Hall is completely separate from the Parish Council. As such the PC has NO involvement with it. For many, many years now it has been run by Tony & Florrie Brown, in fact they have done a magnificent job. We parishioners of Little Munden owe a serious debt of gratitude to them for doing such a superb, and at times thankless, job over the years. And at NO personal gain what-so-ever to themselves.

As we look at the Memorial Hall, thanks to one mans efforts, it is a real credit to our community, a valuable asset (considering Great Munden hall's fate) It is very well maintained and profitable, no expense has been spared in its upkeep, its boasts newly varnished floor, new boiler, recent new toilets, brand new heating, new entrance gates. No debts and monies invested. It is also well booked and used by community groups, playgroups, local residents etc.

However, after many years of freely given service Tony has decided that the time has come for him to hand over the reins to new faces. We need to organise a voluntary committee to take over, we are looking for a chairman, vice-chairman, secretary, treasurer, and committee members etc.

I would like to get together a list of all interested parties (including representatives of current hall users) and call a meeting to get a committee in place so Tony can retire ASAP.

We originally started with the aims as set out in the Parish Plan. These have over a recent period of time been slightly modified to suit considerable, well presented feed back from the youth of the parish, they have formed a vibrant, hard working and enthusiastic driving force pushing us older parishioners to achieve positive results. Our most recent meeting was held on the 18<sup>th</sup> October. A mixed attendance of enthusiastic and communicative parents. At the end of the meeting the council was pleased to hand the further advancement of the project to a pilot committee to be formed from all interested parties. Leadership has been undertaken by Darren Stephens (e-mail: [d.g.stephens@btinternet.com](mailto:d.g.stephens@btinternet.com)) Anyone that feels they may be able to help please contact Darren to be put on the “e” list for mailings. Darren will shortly be calling a meeting to start to make more definite plans. Initial finances should be covered by a small grant made by the Parish Council at our October meeting; this will be enough monies to cover basic's such as room hire, postage etc. We must all wish the committee the very best of luck and look forward to hearing how their progress goes.

**This month there are several items I would like to remind parishioners about briefly.**

**Dog Fouling.** We come to the conclusion the problem of inconsiderate dog owners will always be with us, some problems still exist at Haultwick, on the “coffin” path across the fields to the church. The cricket pitch at Green End is not an open dog latrine, mothers walk across it with their youngsters in pushchairs, it gets on the wheels, then its next in the house where small children are crawling about. Clearing up dog dirt after your pets is a must, whether it is on the fields, footpaths or borders. There are dog dirt & ordinary bins provided, even your own wheelie bin! ### **101 POLICE NON-EMERGENCY NUMBER**

#### **When should callers use 101?**

Callers should use 101 to report less urgent crime or disorder, to contact the police with a general enquiry or to speak to a local officer.

- For example:-  
if their car has been stolen;
- if their property has been damaged;
- where they suspect drug use or dealing;
- if they want to give the police information about crime in their area; or
- if they'd like to speak to a local police officer.

#### **What about more general nuisance?**

The public should continue to call their local council for things like:-

- reporting graffiti;
- abandoned vehicles;
- dumping and fly tipping;
- vandalism;

However in some areas where 101 is already available, the service is in partnership with the local authority and does handle these type of calls.

### **Who will the caller get through to?**

When the public calls 101 they will get through to their local police force.

#### **How will it work?**

101 will be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

When someone calls 101, the system will determine the caller's location and connect them to the police force covering that area. They will hear a recorded message announcing which police force they are being connected to. If a caller is on a boundary between two or more forces, the recorded message will give them a choice of which force to be connected to.

Police call handlers in the force control room will then answer the call and respond appropriately.

The caller will not be put through to a large national call centre.

If the incident is recognised as an emergency, the operator or police call handler will put them through to 999.

#### **How much does a call cost?**

Calls from landlines and mobile networks cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day or the duration of the call.

## LITTLE MUNDEN PARISH COUNCIL PRECIS OF THE PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 20<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER AT LITTLE MUNDEN SCHOOL

The Chairman, five councillors and two members of the public were present. Matters arising from the previous Parish Council were discussed, new Planning Applications, including the Bennington Wind Turbine application which was going to a briefing session on 26<sup>th</sup> October.

The Localism Bill was also discussed as the Parish Council had received "A Plain English Guide to the Localism Bill". Jonathan Pool pointed out that although this was more relevant to larger Parish Councils; it was something the Council should monitor. The Bill was a move for new rights for local communities including the Right to Challenge, the Right to Buy, Neighbourhood Planning and Local Referendums.

The Youth Meeting of 18<sup>th</sup> October was also discussed which had a good turnout. The Parish Council agreed that although David Metcalf had resigned as Chairman, the Council would offer support to the Youth Committee and all agreed that the Parish Council should offer some "start-up" funding.

The future of the Memorial Hall was discussed and all agreed that the Parish Council should have some involvement with it when it was under new management next year. It was pointed out that it would eventually have to have a new Committee and Trustees. Private funding was also available to help with providing more much needed storage and possibly a bar facility.

Yet again, and I say it each month, time has flown by and here we are already at the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> ½ term of the year. Harvest has been and gone and at last we have had to admit defeat and turn on the heating. What a super and warm start to the Autumn we have had.

Our Harvest service was the first church event of the year and was a lovely time of celebration together. It was great to see other members of the community and thanks must also be given to Caroline Franks for leading us in this.
